REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

of the

VILLAGE OF SPRINGWELLS

April 10th, 1923.

Council convened at 9:00 o'clock P.M. President pro tem Ford in the chair. On roll call there were present Councilmen Porath, Neckel, Horger, Ford (4). Absent: President Horger, (1). A quorum being present, the Council was in session. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Ford Motor Company requested that a number of their employes be appointed as Special Police Officers without compensation from the Village.

Chief of Police Burguson submitted a list of names of Ford employes who were recommended by the Ford Motor Company, and recommended that their appointments be confirmed.
