LESSON SEVEN - Reflection

Abstract

Students will reflect on the project from the perspective of their imaginary female character.

Essential Questions

- What was life like for women during WWI?
- What opportunities developed for women after the war efforts?

Duration

1 class period

Assessments

- Reflection Survey
- Photograph drawing

Materials

- Reflection Survey
- drawing paper
- markers/crayons/colored pencils

Setting the Purpose

• Lead a discussion with students about how they think women felt when the men came home.

Procedure

- 1. Tell students they are to imagine they are their imaginary female character and they are answering an interview for a news reporter.
 - a Their interview will be included with many others' in next week's newspaper.
 - b Pass out the <u>reflective survey</u> and tell students to put them in their portfolio when they have finished.
- 2. Finally, students will draw a picture of themselves doing one thing they did for the war efforts.
 - a This will be like a photograph to be included in their portfolio.
 - b The picture should be detailed, but can be wide open for students to use their imagination.
