Math: Number Sense

As a School - The school team will regularly reinforce number sense as they move through Eureka Math and use student data to make instructional decisions.

As a Parent - Families will gain an understanding of the importance of their child's knowledge of number sense and how to support continued learning at home.

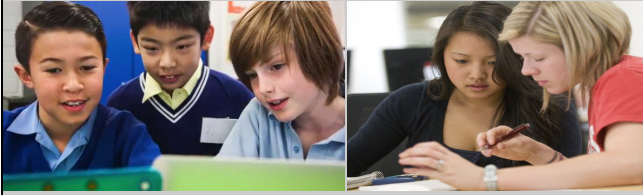
As a student - Students will show progress in their understanding of the relationship between numbers in computation (number sense).

Behavior: Self-Management Skills
