# District Consolidated Plan/District e-Plan for Federal (formula) Grants

April 2, 2019

### District e-Plan

- New (as of late February 2019) requirement for school districts
- Previously
  - Each federal grant had an individual set of planning questions, requirements, and detailed budgeting information in a separate application process in the state IWAS system.
- Currently ISBE is phasing in a new process for how districts apply for federal formula grants over the next two years.
  - This requires coordination and planning by various district administrators who oversee federal formula grants

#### District e-Plan

- Three Phases
- Phase 1: Consolidated District Plan (FY2020)
  - Consolidated plan for multiple federal (formula) grants
- Phase 2: Interactive Dashboard (FY2021)
  - Enable access to ISBE data systems on a single platform
- Phase 3: Consolidated District Application (FY2021)
  - Consolidated application for multiple federal grants

# Consolidated District Plan (CDP)

- First Phase (currently underway for FY20 Federal Grants)
  - Answer one set of planning questions
    - This used to be done separately for each grant
  - Coordination of district administrators managing federal grants
    - USD116 Grant coordinators have been working together to create the plan during the months of February and March
  - Engagement with stakeholders across federal grants
    - We have worked collaboratively on tools and data sources to gather input from various stakeholders

# What is on the consolidated district plan?

- Summary of district's needs assessment
- Stakeholder engagement activities summary
- Non-public consultation information
- Plan to support students' academic, social emotional, and linguistic development
- Plan to support teachers' professional development
- Plan to support parents and families

# What is not part of the Consolidated District Plan?

- Any state level grants (e.g. preschool for all, preschool expansion)
- Any federal competitive grants (e.g. 21st Century Grants)

### Timeline

- The CDP must be approved by the local Board of Education before submission to ISBE
- The CDP must be completed and approved by ISBE before individual grants can be submitted for FY20.
