Here's what parents can do at home:

- ✚ PLAN – make sure your children are rested and ready to learn - attendance is critical for academic success.
- ✚ PLAY – a family game night playing games that help your children to read and practice basic math facts and computation skills is a wonderful boost for your children.
- ✚ TALK – ask about your child's day at school, and don't take "nothing" for an answer.
- ✚ LOOK – check out your child's work as it comes home and review homework together.

Here's what staff and administrators can do in the school:

CREATE – make your school a warm and welcoming place for parents, families and community members.

INVITE – extend an open invitation to parents to visit the classrooms and join you for school events, which will of course be linked to learning.

ENCOURAGE – establish and grow a community of learning by supporting teacher- and-parent-led events that bring parents and educators together to support student success.

Here's what teachers can do in the classroom:

- ✚ RELATE – communicate with parents about good news via notes e-mail, or phone calls.
- ✚ PARTICIPATE – attend your school's events – it's a wonderful way to meet your student' parents and families.
- ✚ TEAM UP – partner with other teachers, staff, and parents to create policies, practices and programs to make success real and available to all students.
