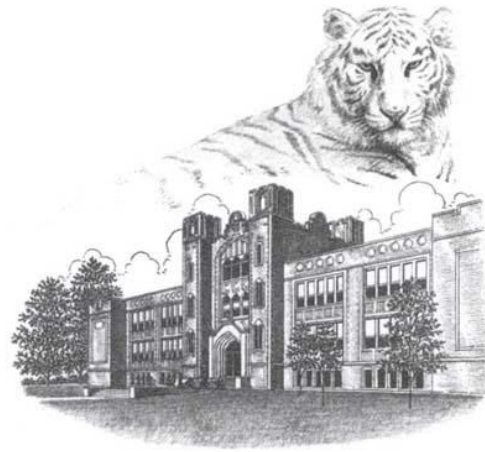

Urbana School District 116 will conduct a summer school program for high school students – incoming 9th through 12th grade – beginning June 4th and ending July 12th. There are two three-week sessions. Students can take ONE class each session. Programs will be offered 4 days each week, generally **Monday through Thursday**. Due to the July 4 holiday, classes will not meet that Wed, July 4 but WILL meet on that Fri, July 6. **Free daily breakfast is in the UHS Commons at 7:45 AM. Free lunch is also provided.** Classes will be held from 8:00AM to 1:00PM at Urbana High School located at 1002 S. Race St., Urbana, IL 61801. Apex online learning classes are available, with priority for enrollment given to UHS students. See your counselor if interested.

Fees

- **Urbana HS students on a reduction/waiver of school fees** pay **\$20 per credit/semester**. If the student attends every day, the \$20 fee will be refunded on the last day of the session.
- **UHS students not on a waiver** pay **\$100.00 per credit/semester**.
- **Out of district student** tuition is **\$120.00 per credit/semester**.
- Full payment must accompany the registration form or enrollment will not be accepted. Refunds will be made only for **cancelled classes**.

Method of Payment

FEES MUST BE PAID FOR WITH CREDIT CARD, CASH, OR MONEY ORDER. **No personal checks will be accepted.** If paying by money order, please make it payable to *Urbana School District #116*. See the UHS bookkeeper to pay by credit.

Insurance

Student accident insurance paid during the 2017-2018 school year will cover the student during summer school hours (while in class or on school district property before and after school). How to Enroll

Enrollment forms along with information on program offerings will be available in the Urbana High School **Main Office and Counseling Office** and **online from the UHS website**. All registration will be done at the high school in the Counseling Office (room 2116) from 8:00AM to 11:00AM and 1:00PM to 4:00PM. Registration will begin Friday, May 11th through Noon on Wednesday, May 30th . **All registration for Summer School must be completed by 12PM on Wed, May 30. There must be a minimum of 15 students registered for each class in order for it to be offered as a teacher-led course this summer. In some cases, we may be able to still have the student complete a course through Apex (online) coursework if the minimum enrollment is not met. REFUNDS WILL BE MADE ON CANCELLED CLASSES ONLY.**

No registration forms will be taken on the first day of any classes.

Cancelling Classes

Classes typically need an enrollment of at least 15 students in order to run. Classes that do not meet the minimum enrollment requirement of 15 students will be cancelled. In cases of low enrollments, some courses may be shortened from two sessions to one or the format may be altered in order to allow them to run with at least 15 students. When it is necessary to cancel a class, full payment of the fees will be refunded. **There will be no refunds after the first day of classes for those that run.**

Student Attendance

Students attend summer school voluntarily, and it is assumed they are sincerely interested in additional learning opportunities. **Daily attendance and punctuality are important. Summer school is NOT advised for those who for any reason cannot maintain regular attendance.**

Since summer school is too short for repeated absences, a student will be dropped (with no refund) from enrollment if he/she misses, **for any reason**, more than one (1) day per 3 week period. This means that if a student has been tardy, that student cannot miss a whole day (1 day + 1 tardy = possible dismissal). ***The principal of summer school will make the determination about dismissal.***

Tardies: Each tardy (less than one hour) is equivalent to 1 hour of absence. (Tardies greater than or equal to one hour is equivalent to ½ day absence.)

1 tardy (< 1hr): 1 hour of absence

2 tardies (< 1 hr): ½ day absence

4 tardies (< 1hr): 1 day of absence

1 tardy (≥ 1hr): ½ day absence

2 tardies (≥ 1hr): 1 day of absence

Students can lose credit for the course on the 3rd or 5th tardy, depending on the category above.

Remember: A student can lose credit for just being tardy to class (student may opt to stay in a course for no credit if they follow all classroom rules and get approval from the summer school principal).

Credit

Credit is granted as indicated under the course offerings: 60 hours = 1 credit. One UHS credit is awarded for each semester a student passes.

Supervision

The school can assume no responsibility for the supervision of pupils except during the actual time they are assigned to be in class and are in attendance.

Allergies/Health Concerns

Course Descriptions

English

English (9, 10, 11) (Session 1)

One English credit

This course is designed as a combination course for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders in need of making up English credit. It will meet the requirements for Composition 9 (Freshman), World Studies English (Sophomore), or American Studies English (Junior). The course will be differentiated to meet the needs of each grade level. This is a writing intensive course that provides specific instruction in a variety of persuasive and expository modes while giving the students a foundation in conventions and research skills. Specific attention will be given to reading strategies and paragraph and essay structure. Specific text and resources will be used for each grade level.

Speech (Session 2)

One semester, One credit.

This course can be used to meet one semester of the Senior English requirement.

In this course, students develop appreciation for and practice in speech concepts, including self-communication, one-to-one communication, small group communication, and public speaking. Good listening skills, essential to communication, are emphasized throughout the course. Students who enroll in this course should have solid writing and research skills as they are necessary for effective completion of informative and persuasive speeches. Some speech assignments include but are not limited to personal experience, brown bag, impromptu, radio, informative, demonstration and persuasive.

Family & Consumer Science

+Independent Living (Session 1)

One semester, One credit. Open to all grade levels.

This course covers the skills needed for living independently such as; cooking, lifestyle, values, decision making, career choices, economics, banking, budgeting, credit, insurance, federal taxes, electronic banking, and current issues in the economy. This course focuses on the identification and management of personal and family resources to meet the needs, values, and wants of individuals and families throughout the life cycle. The course utilizes a variety of project-based experiences to gain knowledge of the topics listed above. This course satisfies the state graduation requirement for Consumer Education.

Mathematics

Algebra I (Session 1)

One or two semesters, one math credit each semester

The summer session of Algebra I is targeted to students who have received a grade of "CO" (Conditional) for first semester and/or failed the class for second semester.

UHS students who received a "CO" for first semester and failed the second semester will, upon successful completion, earn credit for the whole year of Algebra I. -->

(Algebra I continued...)

In this course the content includes: Real world application of all material, pattern recognition, linear relationships, multiple representations of data, slope, slope intercept form, solving equations of one variable, lines of best fit, solving systems of equations, point slope form, solving equations for a specific variable, using x and y intercepts, inequalities of one variable, inequalities of two variables, systems of inequalities, exponential growth and decay, systems of equations with linear and exponential equations, laws of exponents with positive exponents, rational exponents, functions, transformations (reflections, stretching and shrinking), absolute value problems, multiplying and working with binomials, going from standard form to factored form of a polynomial, graphing parabolas, solving quadratic equations. Out of class homework assignments are a part of the course requirements.

Physical Education

Physical Education (Session 1) (If needed, a 2nd session will be added)

One semester, one PE credit

UHS students may take this course to make up a PE credit or as an elective credit (May not be "banked" as a PE credit).

This course will provide students with a variety of activities that will help them develop their own personal fitness programs. The program consists of team sports, running, walking, weight training, and other physical and leisure activities

Health

Health (Session 1)

One semester, one credit

This course fulfills the health requirement for graduation and *is typically* taken freshman year, but some students may take the course their sophomore year. Using the health triangle as a framework, students gain an understanding of many health concepts that will allow them to identify their behaviors, create goals, and make decisions that promote a healthy lifestyle now and in the future.

Social Studies

World Studies – Social Studies (Session 1)

One semester, one credit.

The summer session of World Studies Social Studies is targeted to students who have failed the class during their sophomore. Material covered in this summer session of the course will be different from the content of the fall/spring course. The summer school credit can make up for either semester failure. The course will examine major regions of the world through history, culture, and the themes of geography. This course will also discuss some of the modern issues each region faces.

Civics (Session 1)(If needed, a 2nd session will be added)

One semester, one credit, For rising Jr/Sr students only.

This course meets the Civics (Am Govt) requirement for graduation.

This course will explore the function and operations of the U.S. Federal system, State of Illinois and local governments. Other topics will be law and justice, civil liberties, elections and voting, public opinion and propaganda, and contemporary issues in American politics. Examinations will be given on U.S. and Illinois Constitutions. This course has a weighted option that must be declared within the first three days.

Apex Learning

(Credit Recovery for Various Courses)

Minimum Enrollment: 15 Maximum Enrollment: 50

One or two semesters, one credit each semester

Priority is given to UHS students.

A number of courses are available through Apex learning. Apex courses are computer based and require dedication and self-motivation on the part of the student. Apex class will meet in a computer lab as a regular summer class. Priority will be given to students who have failed courses and/or are behind in total credits needed. Older students will be given preference. Students interested in an Apex course should meet with their counselor to determine which course is most appropriate.

Out of district student tuition is \$120.00 per credit/semester. Full payment must accompany the registration form or enrollment will not be accepted. Please note: A class will not run unless at least 15 students register. Refunds will be made only for cancelled classes.
